## **REGULATION**

1. Schools are encouraged, on an optional basis, to provide students with experiences intended to enhance their understanding and appreciation of the role, purposes and activities of non-profit societies and registered charities.

- 2. School participation in non-profit societies and registered charities includes locally and globally initiated activities to assist individuals and groups in need.
- 3. Schools may conduct group fundraising activities and donate the proceeds to a non-profit society, a registered charity, a family in need, or for sponsorship of a child in another country.
- 4. Schools may participate in approved programs aimed at the collection and distribution of goods for the less fortunate.
- 5. Schools, on an optional basis, may elect to participate in fundraising activities that are conducted external to the school.
- 6. Principals wanting clarification regarding the status of a particular fundraising group are encouraged to contact Communications for assistance.
- 7. Requests by non-profit societies and registered charities for permission to distribute materials to schools are made through Communications, which will share approved opportunities with staff through the Division's internal communications system.
- 8. Although fundraising in schools is permitted, as outlined above, canvassing is prohibited. No person shall canvas, sell or offer to sell goods, services or merchandise to a teacher or a student in a school.
